Grades

- 60% Major (Exam, Test, Quiz, Projects, Essay).
- 40% Minor (Class Participation, Classwork, Homework, Journal, Presentation).

Classroom Expectations

- **Daily Work:** If students do not finish the assignment in class, they are to complete it as homework.
- **Homework:** No late homework is accepted unless it is due to an excused absence. Not turning in homework assignment will be an automatic zero.

> Absent & Missing Work

- **Make-up work:** If a student is absent, it is up to them to ask what they missed and complete it in a timely manner (within 7 days). There will be no penalty for students who were absent at the time of assessment.
- Make-up work does not apply to homework grades.
- The new grade will be no higher than a 70.
- Anything past the 7 days will be an automatic zero. Missing assignments may be completed using Google Classroom. There is no excuse for being unable to complete work.

Rules

- **Respect:** yourself, your classmates, your teacher, your classroom environment
- **Be:** on time, on task responsible for your own actions.
- **Follow:** class procedures, all directions, school policies.
- **No disruptions allowed:** Interrupting lessons, use of personal electronics (cellphones).

Cell Phones

If a parent needs to get a hold of their child, please call the front office. Cell phones must be turned off and cannot be visible on campus during the school day. Students are to have their cell phones in their backpacks, not their pockets. If a student's cell phone disrupts class (is visible, can be heard, vibrates, or is being used) then that student is subject to:

- 1st Offense: confiscation of the device by teacher until class period (or at teacher's discretion).
- 2nd Offense: Confiscation of the device which will be turned in to administrator.

NOTE: If a student refuses to surrender the device or is argumentative during this **process** they will be subject to disciplinary action including possible referral.
